ENGLISH

- Know **possessive nouns** and **pronouns** (possessive: girl's; pronoun: she, my)
- Write nouns in **plural form** (puppy → puppies)
- Identify the **main verb** in a sentence
- Verbs in the **PAST, PRESENT, FUTURE** tense (stopped, stopping, will stop)
- Know the **verb BE** in all its forms (is, am, are, was, were)
- Know how to join two words to make a **contraction** (you will → you'll; he would → he'd)
- **Identify an adjective and identify the noun it describes**
- **Comparative and superlative** adjectives (bigger, biggest)
- **Identify an adverb and identify the verb it describes**
- Correct **mistakes in punctuation, spelling, word usage, sentence fragments, or run-on sentences**

- Know the difference between **rights and responsibilities**
- Identify **Urban, Suburban, Rural communities** from given clues/descriptions
- Answer questions about the **3 branches of US government** (who, where, what):
Legislative, Executive, Judicial
- Write a number inside a **Place Value** chart
- Write numbers in **standard form** (23,456), **expanded form** (20,000+3,000+400+50+6), and **word form** (twenty-three thousand, four hundred fifty-six)
- Know **where to place commas** in numbers (every three numbers to separate thousand, million, etc → 1,340,638)
- Knowing to add and subtract **US currency** in order to **make change**
(\$3.15 + \$1.25 = \$4.40, paid with \$5.00 → \$5.00 - \$4.40 = \$0.60 change)
